Two former JGG Student Teachers spent the month of May doing hands on training at a Cambodian hospital. **Ms. Sut Sreyloeng**, and **Ms. Seng Sokhom** are students in a nursing program offered by Angkor University in Siem Reap. Following three years of nursing and Japanese language instruction in Cambodia they will relocate to Japan where they will continue their nursing and language education for two more years. Upon completion they plan to work for several years in a Japanese hospital.

The program also focuses on preparing these students for the comprehensive state school 12th grade examination and learning about various universities. Finally, JGG continues to provide private tutors related to the 12th grade exam.

Cambodian's tropical climate has taken its toll on JGG's Siem Reap dormitory. Renovation of the building, starting with the kitchen, began earlier this year.

UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN CAMBODIA

After 52 days of having no Covid cases in Cambodia, during the single day of June 28th ten cases of the Omicron variant were detected. While more cases have since been reported (averaging 5 a day), the smaller numbers involved, as well as the reduced severity of the cases, likely reflects Cambodia's high vaccination rate which is in the area of 90%.

The vaccination process in Cambodia continues to move forward. As of the 30th June 2022, a total of 15,086,377 individuals received two doses. 9,480,098 received a booster dose, with 2,924,182 receiving a 4th booster, and 300,934 receiving a 5th booster dose.
