SERIOUS INJURY TO STUDENT VOLUNTEER ALUMNI

At the end of March Chanry It, a Student Volunteer Alumni, had a serious accident at the Phnom Penh Dormitory when she fell from the second floor balcony onto the sidewalk below. She had been accidentally locked out of her room during a break from an online test with her university. She fell while trying to gain access to the room before the test resumed.

While her injuries were serious she is responding to treatment and her doctor says she will make a full recovery in a relatively short time.

Chanry, was one of two JGG Student Teachers who scored an "A" on her 12th grade examination in 2019. Only 1.5% of the 114,000 students taking the test achieved an "A" grade. As a result, she was presented with many awards, met the Prime Minister, and was given a schollarship to one of the best universities in Cambodia.

While JGG is not able to support medical care for its Student Teachers and Student Volunteer Alumni, in this special situation JGG took responsibility for Chanry's hospital expenses. We very much thank those who made donations in support these expenses.



DONATION OF JGG LEARNING CENTERS COMPLETED

As reported in the previous Quarterly Report, in December 2021 JGG donated its Learning Center at Romlech Hun Sen High School. Now, in February 2022 JGG donated its Learning Center located at Bakchinhchien Hun Sen High School. This followed meetings with relevant stakeholders from local authorities including the village and commune chief, the education department, and the school

principal where details of the transfer were decided. Both learning centers will be under the control of the government's Romlech and Bakchinhchien Hun Sen High School Management Committee. The buildings will be used to benefit the students and the communities as a whole.

While the building transfers are now completed, JGG will continue to have a presence in the schools. Its focus will be on providing English and computer training to the remaining eight Student Teachers who will graduate at the end of the current school term. JGG will also fund the training these eight students are receiving as they prepare for their 12th grade examination.

NEW STUDENT VOLUNTEER ALUMNI (SVA)

Six Student Teachers who graduated from Bakchinhchien Hun Sen High School and two Student Teachers graduating from Romlech Hun Sen High School became Student Volunteer Alumni (SVAs) and are now attending universities in Siem Reap and Phnom Penh.

Most SVA's need to work full-time to support themselves (and to help their families) while attending university full-time. Already, five of the new SVAs have good jobs in the education and real estate sector. Their strong English and leadership skills learned as JGG Student Teachers make them very desirable employees.

Before the new SVAs left for their universities, JGG's Director organized a meeting with them. At this meeting many topics were discussed including the JGG dormitories, JGG's loan program to help new SVAs financially survive the first year at university, and the importance of choosing a good major to study. The point was also made that the new SVAs should look for jobs that allow them to keep using and learning English.

English language competency is essential to getting a good job in Cambodia. English is also key to university success since most of the textbooks and computer programs used are in English.

LAPTOP COMPUTER DONATIONS

JGG's transfer of its learning centers included all the materials and equipment inside the centers except for the 14 laptop computers. Six of these laptop computers were donated to JGG's current 12th grade Student Teachers, four were given to Student Volunteer Alumni in Phnom Penh and Siem Reap, two were given to Bakchinhchien Hun Sen High School administration, and the remaining two were given to former JGG staff.



OVERVIEW OF COVID-19 IN CAMBODIA

DURING FIRST QUARTER 2022

The number of COVID-19 cases declined in Cambodia during the first quarter of 2022. So far during the pandemic the number of confirmed cases total 135,585 with 131,598 recoveries and 3,054 deaths (Updated 29th March 2022).

The vaccination program in Cambodia continues to move ahead. **As of 30th March 2022**, a total of 14,822,910 individuals received their first dose and second dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. This represents over 90% of the eligible candidates in the country. 7,943,546 received a booster and 1,165,961 received a second booster.
