## SIEM REAP PRIMARY SCHOOL LIBRARY PROJECT

The construction of a Library/Meeting Building located at Kok Khnang Primary School in Siem Reap made significant progress during the second quarter. The completion of this building is being funded by John Givonetti Giving.



Following the closure of its English Language Outreach Program which occurred about the same time as the arrival of Covid, JGG narrowed its focus to the operation of its dormitories in Phnom Penh and Siem Reap for students studying at universities at these locations.

At the end of 2023 IGG announced that in the future it would begin funding infrastructure projects in Cambodia and possibly elsewhere as allowed. The resources Library/Meeting Building had been partially completed when the school's funding ran out. JGG not only agreed to provide funds to complete the project but added to the design to increase the building's



utility. The project is expected to be operational by the end of 2024.



## **Sreyloeng Sut Achieves Government Nursing Credentials**

JGG's longest serving Student Teacher has become a **Licensed Associate Degree Nurse** after passing the government examination.

JGG English Student Teachers normally started studying English with JGG in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade, with the best students becoming JGG English Student Teachers in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Sreyloeng, who began studying English with JGG in the fourth grade, was able to begin her JGG teaching career in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade. She was the only Student Teacher to do this.



In January 2025 Sreyloeng will begin studying to become a Bachelor of Science Degree Nurse at Health Sciences University in Phnom Penh. This university is the best nursing school in the country.

While Sreyloeng waits for the January semester to begin, she is volunteering 60 hours a week at a hospital in Phnom Penh which is supported by a US charity. Congratulations!
