JGG CONTINUES A PERIOD 'S OF TRANSITION

JGG continues to develop a revised program structure. Unfortunately, this change is taking much longer than expected.

COVID was the original headwind, resulting in a two-year delay. While that situation began to improve during the first quarter of 2022, a remnant of COVID, a school year shift of 4 to 5 months, continues.

JGG had hoped that the final group of its Student Teachers would have competed high school and moved to JGG's dormitories in Phnom Penh and Siem Reap by the end of the second quarter 2022 so they could attend university. These graduating Student Teachers would have been joined by JGG's first selection of non-Student Teachers to stay at its dormitories.

However, the 12th grade exam, which signals the closing of the high school year will not be administered until sometime in December 2022. The results from this exam are the basis for almost all higher education scholarships in Cambodia. Thus, universities have had to similarly adjust their calendars. As such, the first semester for universities will not begin until January or February of 2023 instead of September or October 2022. It will not be until the first quarter of 2023 before new students arrive at JGG's dormitories.

Another headwind is the strong economic downturn which has had an impact on JGG's funding. What comes down eventually goes up, but until there is greater clarity JGG will proceed cautiously and limit its activities to the Phnom Penh and Siem Reap dormitories. New activities will be added once JGG is certain that they are fiscally sustainable.

Meanwhile, JGG is getting close to the completion of the renovation of the Siem Reap dormitory. This was a larger project than anticipated as several deficiencies that took place during the original construction were revealed and require correction.

Based on all the above, going forward JGG will amend its Quarterly Report to a shorter form. The report will be expanded based on any increased in activities or special events.

UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN CAMBODIA

The number of COVID-19 cases has been dropping in Cambodia in this third quarter of 2022. According to the Ministry of Health authorities, since the onset of the pandemic in early 2020, **as of September 30, 2022**, Cambodia has had a total of 137,881 confirmed cases of COVID-19, 134,754 recoveries and 3,056 deaths.

The vaccination process in Cambodia continues to move forward. As of the 30th September 2022, a total of 15,195,683 individuals got vaccinated, 14,549,947 received two doses. 9,480,098 received a booster dose, with 4,316,292 receiving a 4th booster, and 863,197 receiving a 5th booster dose.
